

## Don't miss out on the Warm Home Discount

Have you contacted our Affordable Warmth Advisor Andy Price about the Warm Home Discount?

This is a Government scheme, regulated by ofgem, in which energy providers offer a £140 rebate on your Winter fuel bills – but most of us have to apply for it.

Andy can check if your supplier offers the WHD, if you qualify to receive it, and apply on your behalf. If you've missed the deadline to apply to your energy provider, or you're with a company which doesn't offer the WHD, you may still be able to claim by switching energy providers. ## Bats about our new development

AHA goes to great lengths to ensure our developments have a positive effect on their surroundings. But we've had to take unusual steps at our latest site – to check that we don't disturb any current residents.



In March we were delighted to purchase the disused St Paul's Church in Ladywell, a well-known local landmark which will be familiar to anyone travelling along Cousland Road. But the mature trees here are a favourite place for bats – meaning the old building presents an opportunity for nesting and roosting.

As responsible developers, AHA appointed specialists Ecology Consultants to carry out a number of surveys, to ensure that there are no bats roosting in the building.

They confirmed there were no bats in the belfry – or anywhere else for that matter. So the disused church building will now be demolished and a new development of 12 cottage flats and terraced houses will be built in its place.

And the original church bell will continue to ring, with The Church of Scotland planning to use it in another location.

As part of AHA's on-going commitment to provide high quality, safe and energy efficient homes for rent, the development team are committed to securing sites for new housing.

In recent years we have successfully secured a number of 'brownfield' sites at the heart of our local communities. Not only does this provide an opportunity for new housing where there is a demonstrated need, but it makes good use of existing land and lifts the general appearance of the area.

Our planning application is currently with West Lothian Council. All being well, we hope that the new homes will be ready by the end of 2019.



## Story Starters and The Imagination Library

AHA is delighted to launch Story Starters – an exciting new programme designed to inspire a love of books from an early age. A team of skilled volunteers will work in small groups, with children under 5 and their parents, to bring storytelling sessions to life.

Books are not only great for a young person's imagination; they help them learn about the world, while developing language skills, confidence and independence. Which is why AHA signed up to Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, an initiative which provides tenants with children under 5 with a free book, to keep, every month until the child's 5th birthday.

Now The Imagination Library has developed the Story Starters scheme – to support parents to turn a book into a whole new world of possibilities.

Story Starters is about more than reading a story out loud to a child. Volunteers are trained to use the book to develop games, songs, and discussions with children, to bring the story to life.

### We need your help!

We need volunteers who can devote just one hour, once a week to read stories out loud and pass on the magic of books. We would also ask them to commit to attending a training session at AHA offices on Thursday 22nd November 2018 to become a Story Starter.



They will be professionally trained in listening and getting to know children, while using picture books as a context for learning, bringing stories to life through imagination and play. They will also learn how to help other parents gain confidence and feel comfortable reading stories out loud.

## Introducing the Riverside Community Fridge

The Riverside Community Wing is home to a brand new Community Fridge project.

Community Fridges are located in communal places, where surplus food donated by local businesses and individuals can be shared.

By purchasing the fridge, AHA hopes to give local residents the chance to access nutritious food, save money and reduce waste.

As well as locally grown vegetables from our community garden, a delivery of food is received weekly from Tesco, and a collection is made from Greggs. Produce may vary but will usually include: fresh fruit and vegetables, fresh pizzas, and yoghurts.

AHA's Community Engagement Officer Barbara Boertien said: "This project will benefit people of all ages who are affected by low income, providing access to fresh food and encouraging carbon wise decisions in terms of food purchase and food waste."
